

In 1973, the Thursday Lunch Bunch (TLB) was founded to provide meals to seniors in the community in partnership with St. Peter's Catholic Church, which was located across the street from Alamo Heights UMC on Broadway. Over time, the organizers recognized the need for fellowship, in addition to the meals, which changed the program from delivering the meals to serving lunch. Shortly thereafter, the Thursday Lunch Bunch grew to feed an average of 150-200 senior citizens each week. At that time, about 20% of the senior adults dining were members of AHUMC. In 1994, the church relocated from Broadway to Basse Road, where the Thursday Lunch Bunch has continued to feed between 100-150 senior citizens with 40% members here at AHUMC.



The Lunch Bunch outreach program is a self-sustaining ministry and receives no annual budget funds. To help offset the cost of the meals, the preparation of the meals is completely a volunteer effort, and Alamo Heights UMC does not charge for utilities or building use as we believe that the ministry to senior adults is important.

Every week an average of 30 Ministry Partners (AKA volunteers) help plan, prepare, decorate, dispense meal tickets, register guests, cook, serve, and clean-up each Thursday. Our team of cooks are the best, including the dessert bakers along with a kitchen manager and our faithful custodians. Lunch Bunch is all about building community and fellowship so we make it a point to celebrate birthdays, sing familiar songs, and pray before we break bread together. The finishing touch is calling each guest by name with welcoming smiles of joy and love!

GLANCE

The Thursday Lunch Bunch program starts in September and ends in May with themes for Valentine's Day, Texas Independence Day, St. Patrick's Day, Easter, Fiesta, the San Antonio Spurs, Halloween, Thanksgiving, and a special day remembering and honoring our military for Memorial Day and Veteran's Day.

As guests arrive our church organist plays the piano and afterward our emcee leads singing some of our favorite songs along with jokes and laughter. Following the introduction, we sing a hymn and a blessing is given by a pastor or clergy staff. After the blessing of the meal, our amazing Ministry Partners bring food to each table.



In December of 2023 the Thursday Lunch Bunch will celebrate the 10th anniversary of the special Christmasthemed lunch called "Holiday Delight". For this festive occasion, we serve over 200+ guests with a holiday meal, dessert, and have favors for each guest to take home! Our Ministry Partners take special care to decorate over 25 tables, each with a different Christmas theme. This event is one of our largest and most celebrated events to really usher in the Christmas-spirit.









Another ministry called "Reaching Maximum Independence" (RMI) began to join and dine with us in 2012. RMI's mission is to help individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) in reaching their maximum level of independence, and be more engaged in our community. RMI has been a massive help in folding and putting away all of the chairs and tables. We have been so grateful for their help and it has been a huge blessing to the Thursday Lunch Bunch as that was a challenge to our senior volunteers. Thank you TEAM RMI!

Also in 2012, Thursday Lunch Bunch began sharing any extra funds by donating to the missions of our church and other ministries. Lunch Bunch's first mission project went toward the Burundi Mission in Africa raising over \$1,000 for the purchase of goats! Yes, goats! These goats produced milk (and more goats!) which translated to more goats and more milk for those in need. One of AHUMC's former pastors and team members taught and mentored pastors in Burundi and continued for over six years.

Over the past ten years, Lunch Bunch has given to a variety of charities such as Asbury UMC Benevolence Fund/Food and Prayer Ministry, AHUMC Counseling Ministry, Heart Pillow Ministry, Flower Ministry, Kairos Prison Ministry, MOPS (Mothers of Preschoolers),

Prayer Shawl Ministry, Providence Place, and Junto Servis/ Brownville Matamoras Ministry that delivers food by boat to people in Mexico. Additionally, the Lunch Bunch was able to raise over \$3,000 from 2017-2019 to help pay for the "Hearing Loop" in the Sanctuary.



The Lunch Bunch has been proud to be a part of the AHUMC School Supplies Project for the past five years. This idea began with two Thursday Lunch Bunch ladies who are retired teachers. They continue to lead the effort along with the many other retired school teachers who are a part of our Lunch Bunch team. Partnering with the AHUMC Hope Center ministry, Lunch Bunch collects and organizes school supplies for underserved kids in the area. We serve all five Alamo Heights ISD schools and surrounding nearby schools in the Northeast ISD a total of 12 schools. Approximately \$1,500 each year is received in monetary donations along with supplies and backpacks. Volunteers contact the schools ahead of time to learn what is needed, and then shop to fulfill those needs during July.



We are so grateful to the those who have rallied around this project with their generosity as well as those who do the shopping and delivery to schools.

The "Ministry Partners" have had aprons of many designs and colors over the years - navy, red, yellow, and white along with the red cap - "The Bunch."




Since 2013, we now wear black aprons with the embroidered Cross and Flame and Alamo Heights UMC lettering in white.


